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
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
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I. Plégmaresidential complex in Tinos




The area of the project is divided:

In three horizontal zones in terms of usage (parking space, interior living space, exterior living space), and in three vertical zones in terms of each residence's self-sufficiency and privacy.

There is a slight but significant hight difference between the levels of the parking lots, the interior spaces and the exterior spaces in order to seperate the uses, while at the same time taking advantage of the downhill field.

All three residences are oriented properly in order to serve as viewpoints to the aegean blue.












II. The T-shaped wall

family residence in Kalamata



The T-shaped rock wall is the signature element of the design proposal and it is built with natural local stone. This wall seperates the living area from the bedrooms while at the same time defines the atrium which constitutes the core of the residence and a dining area for the family on sunny days.

The three bedrooms are located around the atrium keeping a hallway all around it to provide comfortable access and circulation in the house.

Great attention was given to the existing vegetation, as most of the trees are being kept at the exact same position, all around the residence.















III. Common Place residential complex in Sifnos



The key element in the design of this residential complex is the need to combine the traditional cycladic architecture of Sifnos (the three existing buildings in the middle of the area) with the contemporary needs of the visitors. An important goal was to keep the balance between privacy and socializing amongst the residencies. The existing buildings will host the common places of these three seperated residences, such as an open living room, a traditional wood stove and a dining area.

Simple design lines form discreet white volumes, respectful of the traditional architectural values of Sifnos island. The downhill landscape is used as an advantage to partially hide these volumes in the ground in order to keep an undisturbed view to the aegean sea, but also Chrisopigi monastery peninsula from any possible spot.



IV. The in-between

twin residences in Kos

Mastihari, Kos, Greece designed in 2019 built in 2022





The goal of this project was to create a feeling of separation and privacy for each of the four appartments while at the same time succeed a unified complex. This was achieved by proposing an atrium with dense vegetation in the core of the designed composition. on the right and left of this atrium there are permeable elements, that ensure the privacy of the residences while at the same time give acces to the atrium, allowing the endless light to invade the space and providing a view at the vegetation instead of a wall.









V. Three Sisters 4* hotel extension in Kos









VI. Enclosed summer house in Sifnos

Skaloto, Sifnos, Greece designed in 2019







This residence's interior and built exterior spaces are strictly enclosed to a square, with an imposing wall in the middle, that gently seperates the living areas from the bedrooms, creating a more private feeling where it is needed. An atrium is positioned at the core of the three fully autonomous bedrooms, and a circular hallway around this atrium ensures that all bedrooms have undisturbed view (large openings) to the nature - exterior spaces are detached from one another for extra privacy.


While the wall is considered to be the separation axis of living and sleeping areas, the pool serves as the connection of the two.










VIII. Splitted vacation houses in Sifnos

XI. Kamáres vacation rooms in Kos


Kos city, Greece designed in 2021 built in 2021







The traditional greek archs (kamares) of multiple sizes and landings, are the signature element of this project. they are used to seperate the living area from the sleeping area in these microliving appartments, in a slight and gentle way. they put the rooms in frames, giving the sence of a larger/ more spatious interior. All furniture are built on site, in respect of the traditional cycladic interiors.









XII. The old warehouse

house renovation in Marousi

Marousi, Athens, Greece designed in 2020 -ongoing project-





An existed abandoned warehouse is transformed in a spacious two - bedroom appartment, with a courtyard.

The initial geometry of the warehouse is kept, while multiple wide openings are added to provide the interior space with plenty of natural light. The main bedroom is located at the most quiet place and is partly dettached from the other living and sleeping areas.
